Topaz name comes from Topazios, the old Greek name for an island in the Red Sea, now called Zabargad.

COLOR: All colors are possible.

DURABILITY:

HARDNESS (Mohs scale).....8

TOUGHNESS.....Poor (because of cleavage)

STABILITY:

Heat.....High heat can alter color.

Light.....Generally stable, but some brown stones fade

Chemical....Very slightly.

CARE and CLEANING:

Type of Cleaning *Advisability*

Ultrasonic cleaning.....Never

Steam cleaning.....Never

Warm, soapy water.....Safe

- Treated blue topaz is available in a variety of shades from light to dark blue. The treatment is stable and the stones are very reasonably priced.
- Topaz is a birthstone for November.
